

Using RSS Feeds on the Port Washington Web Site



What are RSS Feeds?

RSS feeds make sections of a website available for use by other sites, allowing users to access updated information from various sources in a single location. Known as feed aggregators, feed readers, news readers or simply aggregators.

The benefits of subscribing to RSS feeds are:

- Updates from multiple websites in one place
- Updates without providing your email address
- Ability to read content from your favorite websites in one location

Subscribing to a Page

- Click the **RSS Feed** button on the page you wish to subscribe.
- Visitors can subscribe in one of two ways:
 1. Click one or more of buttons on the page to subscribe using a service. You need to have an account with the service to subscribe.
 - Available Aggregators:
 - Google
 - Yahoo
 - MSN
 - Pageflakes
 - Netvibes
 2. Click the URL supplied to manually add the RSS feed to your aggregator homepage.

Note: You can add an RSS feed to more than one aggregator homepage, but you must have a valid account with each aggregator.

Subscribe

Click one or more of the buttons to the left to subscribe using a service. You need to have an account with the service to subscribe. If you'd like to add the RSS feed manually, you can use this URL:

Why should I subscribe?

Once you subscribe to an RSS feed, you can view links to the content on that page from your personalized service homepage.

What is an RSS feed?

RSS is a standardized format that lets you subscribe to a website's content. The subscription is called a feed.
